Apolytikion of the Holy Cross: So-son Ky-ri-e ton la-on Sou ke ev-lo-gi-son tin kli-ro-no-mi-an Sou ni-kas tis va-si-lef-si ka-ta var-va-ron do-ru-me-nos ke to son fi-la-ton di-a tou Stav-rou Sou po-li-tev-ma. Save O Lord, save Your people and bless Your inheritance. Give victory to those who battle evil and protect us all by Your Holy Cross.

Entrance Hymn: (sung by the clergy)

Exalt the Lord our God and worship at His footstool, for Holy is He. Save us O Son of God, Who rose from the dead, to Thee we sing: Alleluia.

Apolyitikion of the Resurrection: Let all things above in heaven rejoice, and let all things below on earth be glad. With all the might and strength of His arm, an eternal deed the Lord did perform. Beneath His feet He has trampled down death by death, and first born of the dead has He become. From the womb of Hades has He delivered us, and to all the world has granted His great mercy.

Apolytikion of St. John the Baptist: *The memory of the just is observed with hymns of praise; for you O Forerunner the witness of the Lord is sufficient. You have proved to be truly more venerable than the*

prophets. Since you were granted to baptize in the river, the One Whom they proclaimed. Therefore, you strove for truth, proclaiming with joy the Good News, even to those in Hades: that God was manifested in the flesh, and takes away the sins of the world, and grants to us His great mercy.

Victorious Lady, mighty champion, defending us, we your servants, now inscribe to you this hymn of thanks, for you rescued us from suffering and tribulation. Theotokos, with your power that can never fail, keep us safe from every danger our whole life long. That we may cry to you: Rejoice, O Bride unwedded.

Trisagion Hymn: Ton Stav-ron Sou pro-ski-noumen De-spo-ta ke tin a-gi-an Sou A-na-sta-sin do-xazo-men. Your Cross we Venerate O Master and Your Holy Resurrection we glorify.

 <u>Holy Communion</u> is offered only to Orthodox Christians who are in good canonical standing with the church and who have prepared through prayer and fasting. Everyone is invited to receive the Antidoron (Blessed Bread) at the end of the Divine Liturgy.
 <u>Order for Holy Communion</u> — With Sunday School in session the order for Holy Communion will be as follows:

 Choir
 Altar boys
 Sunday school teachers (who will line up in middle aisle (right) before Communion).
 Sunday school students (who will line up in the middle aisle (left) before Communion).

6. Parents with recently Baptized children can line up before the Sunday School Teachers.

Epistle Lesson: Verse. O Lord, save Your people and bless Your inheritance. To You, O Lord, I have cried, O my God.

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews. (Hebrews 4:14-16; 5: 1-6)

BRETHREN, since we have a high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is bound to offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not take the honor upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him, "Thou art my Son, today I have begotten thee"; as he says also in another place, "Thou art a priest for ever, after the order of Melchizedek."

Gospel Lesson: Mark 8:34-38; 9:1

The Lord said: "If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? For what can a man give in return for his life? For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

Communion Hymn: (Psalm 4:6) *E-si-mi-o-thi ef' i-mas to Fos tou pro-so-pou Sou, Ky-ri-e. Alliluia. Let the Light of Your face shine on us, O Lord. Alleluia.*

After the Great Entrance, you are invited to turn to page 63 of the spiral Divine Liturgy book to follow the different prayers and hymns of the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great, celebrated on the five Sundays of Great Lent.

At the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy, after the sermon, there will be a procession of the Holy Cross. The service is found on p. 152 of the spiral Divine Liturgy book.

Divine Liturgy to begin at 9:45 a.m. on the Sundays of Great Lent

Since the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great is offered on each Sunday of Lent, and this Divine Liturgy is slightly longer than the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom, the Divine Liturgy will begin at 9:45 a.m. from March 24-April 28. The Choir will begin the Doxology at 9:35 a.m.





MORE MINISTRY NEWS & UPDATES

Sunday, April 7 - Third Sunday of Lent - Veneration of the Holy Cross

On the 3rd Sunday of Great Lent we celebrate the Veneration of the Cross; the Cross helps us to prepare for the Crucifixion of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We are not just witnessing from afar the passions of our Lord, but we participate in them. In the Synaxarion we read, "Through the forty-day fast, we too are in a way crucified, dying to the passions." Our efforts to keep up with the Fast, through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, might take a toll over our bodies; we need help and encouragement, and the help and encouragement comes from the power of the Cross. In the middle of Great Lent, the Church gives its faithful a sign of victory, one that can bring strength to them in this time of fasting. The Sunday of the Holy Cross is one that brings everything into perspective, especially with the Gospel reading (Mark 8:34-9:1), the Lord saying to all His disciples. "If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" A special procession of the Holy Cross, on a tray covered with flowers, will be held at the end of the Divine Liturgy.

Young Adult Meeting-Monday, April 8-

Our Young Adult Dinner/Discussion will be held on Monday, April 8. (We normally meet on the second Thursday of the month, but for April will be meeting on the second Monday, returning to our normal schedule in May). Our meeting will be from 6:30-9:30 p.m., a little longer than usual to facilitate the movie "The Passion of the Christ" which we will watch, and then have a discussion afterwards. Tuesdays of Lent - Great Compline -

The service of the Great Compline will be read on the following Tuesdays of Lent—April 9, April 16 and April 23. This service lasts about an hour and consists of Psalms and hymns of repentance. Service Books for this service will be available.

Wednesdays of Lent - 9th Hour and Pre-Sanctified Liturgy-

The Divine Liturgy of the Pre-Sanctified Gifts (also called Pre-Sanctified Liturgy) will be held on the Wednesdays during Great Lent. This service consists of Vespers with Holy Communion that was "Pre-Sanctified" the previous Sunday. It is an opportunity to receive Holy Communion frequently during the season of fasting. The Pre-Sanctified Liturgy is preceded by the reading of the 9th Hour, a short service with penitential prayers as well as the recitation of the Creed, a pre-requisite for the reception of Holy Communion. Service books for this service will be available. The Pre-Sanctified Liturgy will be celebrated on the following Wednesdays of Great Lent: Wednesday, April 10; Wednesday, April 17 and Wednesday, April 24. Several of our ministries will host a dinner as indicated on the schedule below. Each ministry is encouraged to attend at least one Pre-Sanctified Liturgy as follows:

Fridays of Lent - 9th Hour and Pre-Sanctified Liturgy-

The Pre-Sanctified Liturgy has Traditionally been celebrated on Wednesdays AND Fridays of Great Lent. The 9th Hour will begin at 9:30 a.m., with the Pre-Sanctified Liturgy from 10:00-11:15 a.m. The Pre-Sanctified Liturgy will be held on the Fridays of Lent as follows: Friday, April 12; Friday, April 19 and Friday, April 26.

Fridays of Lent - The Salutations to the Virgin Mary (Heretismoi)-

This service also lasts about an hour and is a series of prayers and devotions that invoke the intercessions of the Virgin Mary for our salvation. It will be held on April 12 and April 19.
