

Apolytikion of Palm Sunday: *Tin Ki-nin A-na-sta-sin pro tou Sou pa-thous pi-stou-me-nos, ek ne-kron i-gi-ras ton La-za-ron Chri-ste o The-os. O-then ke i-mis os i pe-des, ta tis ni-kis sim-vo-la fe-ron-tes, Si to ni-ki-ti tou tha-na-tou vo-o-men. Ho-sa-na en tis i-psi-stis, Ev-lo-gi-me-nos O Er-ho-me-nos en o-no-ma-ti Ky-ri-ou.*

Of the common Resurrection, before Your passion assuring us, from the dead, You raised Lazarus O Christ our God. Wherefore, like the children, we also carry the symbols of victory. To You, the Victor over death, we cry: Hosanna in the Highest, Blessed is He who cometh in the name of the Lord.

Apolytikion of Palm Sunday: *We were buried with You through Baptism, O Christ our God, and thus by Your Resurrection we have been granted immortal life, and extolling You we cry aloud, "Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are You, the One who comes in the name of the Lord."*

Kontakion: *In heaven upon a throne, on earth upon a colt, being carried O Christ our God, You accepted the angels' praise and the children's extolling hymns, as they cried out to You: Blessed is He that comes, fallen Adam to recall again.*

Megalinarion: *God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us. Prepare the feast and come with rejoicing. Let us magnify Christ; bearing palms and branches, let us sing praise to Him: Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord, our Savior, our Savior.*

Communion Hymn: (Psalm 118:26) *Ev-lo-gi-me-nos o er-ho-me-nos en o-no-ma-ti Ky-ri-ou, va-si-lefs tou I-sra-il. Allilua
Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel. Alleluia.*

Holy Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who are in good canonical standing with the church and who have prepared through prayer and fasting. Everyone is invited to receive the Antidoron (Blessed Bread) at the end of the Divine Liturgy.

Order for Holy Communion—*With Sunday School in session the order for Holy Communion will be as follows:*

1. Choir
2. Altar boys
3. Sunday school teachers (who will line up in middle aisle (right) before Communion).
4. Sunday school students (who will line up in the middle aisle (left) before Communion).
5. Then the rest of the congregation (side areas then the main section).

Readings for Sunday, April 28

Prokeimenon: Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good. His mercy endures forever.

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians (Chapter 4:4-13)

4 Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!

5 Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand.

6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; 7 and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

8 Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things. 9 The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you.

10 But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at last your care for me has flourished again; though you surely did care, but you lacked opportunity. 11 Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: 12 I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. 13 I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

Gospel Lesson: John 12:1-18

Six days before Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazaros was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they made him a supper; Martha served, and Lazaros was one of those at table with him. Mary took a pound of costly ointment of pure nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped his feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (he who was to betray him), said "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not that he cared for the poor but because he was a thief, and as he had the money box he used to take what was put into it. Jesus said, "Let her alone, let her keep it for the day of my burial. The poor you always have with you, but you do not always have me."

When the great crowd of the Jews learned that he was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazaros, whom he had raised from the dead. So the chief priests planned to put Lazaros also to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus.

The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazaros out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign.

Divine Liturgy to begin at 9:45 a.m. on the Sundays of Great Lent

Since the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great is offered on each Sunday of Lent, and this Divine Liturgy is slightly longer than the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom, the Divine Liturgy will begin at 9:45 a.m. from March 24-April 28. The Choir will begin the Doxology at 9:35 a.m.

Sunday, April 28 - Palm Sunday– The entrance of Christ into Jerusalem

There is a short vespers service of Holy Monday that is generally suppressed in parish usage. We have done this the past three years and will continue this year as well. The Bridegroom Service is done Palm Sunday night. The Vespers of Holy Monday is the transition from the joy of Palm Sunday to the sorrow of Holy Week. The service begins with bright colors, green for Palm Sunday, and in the middle of the service, the colors change to the dark purple of Holy Week. The service will be from 5:00-5:45 p.m., with the Bridegroom Service beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Holy Monday, April 29, Holy Tuesday April 30, Holy Wednesday May 1- Pre-Sanctified Liturgy on Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, and Holy Wednesday mornings

These three Pre-Sanctified Liturgies include important Scripture readings—from Exodus, from Job and from the Gospels. The Gospel readings are the last teachings of Jesus to His disciples on Holy Monday and Holy Tuesday. The Gospel of Holy Wednesday morning is the first act of the Passion, the betrayal by Judas. The Scripture readings of these services are an important part of the Holy Week narrative.

Holy Tuesday, April 30– His Grace Bishop Sevastianos of Zela to visit our Community

His Grace Bishop Sevastianos of Zela will be with us and preside over the Service of the Bridegroom on Holy Tuesday Evening. Please join us in welcoming His Grace again to our community.

Holy Wednesday, May 1– Holy Unction Service

There will be a Sacrament of Holy Unction for Children 3:00-4:00 p.m. & a Sacrament of Holy Unction for adults 7:00-8:30 p.m. (Theme: washing away of sin; healing of soul and body)

Holy Thursday, May 2- The Service of the Passion

There will be the service of the Holy Passion 6:30-10:00 p.m., where there will Reading of the 12 Gospels, Procession of the Crucified Christ (Themes: The Betrayal, Trial and Death of Christ, the Passion). All night Vigil will follow the service.

Good Friday, May 3

There will be Epitaphios Decoration 11:00 a.m., followed by Apokathelosis Service 3:00-4:00 p.m. Lamentations and Procession with the Epitaphios will be at 7:00-8:30 p.m.

Holy Saturday, May 4

The service of the Anastasis will begin at 11:00 p.m. on Holy Saturday evening, with the chanting of the Canon followed by Pachal Liturgy 12:30 a.m.

PASCHA, May 5

There will be Agape Vespers 11:00 a.m. followed by Easter Egg Hunt for children at noon.
