Catechism Lesson for Adults and Teens 12th Sunday of Luke

10 Healed of Leprosy

Read the Gospel Passage for this Sunday Luke 17:12-19

Contextual Background:

-Leprosy was a contagious skin disease that affected many people at that time. The Jews had specific rules of "socially distancing" those who had leprosy from the rest of the community. If a leper was miraculously healed, there was a rule that said a priest had to examine them first before letting them back to the community, giving them a "clean bill of health".

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why do you think all but one leper didn't come back?
 - a. They couldn't find Jesus
 - b. They were so excited to go see a priest to receive a "clean bill of health"
 - c. They weren't grateful enough to make the effort
 - d. They got what they wanted
 - e. They thought it was time something good happened to them.
